We had an ambitious plan for work day. Our objective was to make progress towards resolving our storage problem, improve the exterior appearance of the church, and to complete other miscellaneous maintenance and repair projects.

Fifteen projects were planned. Work was done on all projects, except one. Eight projects were totally completed. Work is still pending on seven projects. Our biggest accomplishment was eliminating the use of all rented storage units at Abbott's Mini Storage. We've worked for the last year to eliminate all five units which cost the church \$345 per month. *We emptied the last unit and are no longer using any off-site rental storage.* This saves the church money and also the inconvenience of moving items between there and the church. An equally important accomplishment was eliminating two dump trucks full of unneeded items. The exterior appearance of the church was greatly improved. This Work Day was a success.

Your Board of Trustees will continue to pursue the completion of all these projects. Of course, volunteers are always welcome to assist. Contact any Trustee if you would like to help. Using our dedicated volunteers means that church funds will not be spent on contractors and that funds can be spent on more spiritual endeavors.
